# **ENERGY**

Finalised the industry position paper unlocking local capacity for grid expansion to motivate the need for new thinking regarding state procurement. This new discourse centres on a strategic procurement approach, rather than an administrative procurement approach which is currently the case.



## **MUNICIPALITIES**

Established a pilot project in the City of Ekurhuleni to address poor municipal service delivery across electricity and water. This work will continue in the new year to further an active partnering model between industry and the municipality.



## **EXPORTS**

Initiated the CBAM Industry Working Group based on the assumption that the Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism is here to stay but there is room to negotiate better terms for SA industry, and it is therefore critical to prepare and align.
